Do Not Leave Fires Unattended - Your burn barrel or your brush pile.

Take Care & Watch for Signs of Heat Exhaustion: The signs of heat exhaustion in a person are cool, moist, pale, or flushed skin; heavy sweating; headache; nausea or vomiting; dizziness; and exhaustion. A person experiencing heat exhaustion may have a normal body temperature, or it is likely to be rising. If you suspect someone is suffering from heat exhaustion, move the person to a cooler place. Remove or loosen tight clothing and apply cool, wet cloths, such as towels or sheets dipped in water. If the person is conscious, give him or her cool water to drink. Make sure the person drinks slowly. Give a half glass of cool water every 15 minutes. Let the person rest in a comfortable position, and watch carefully for changes in his or her condition. Do not give liquids that contain alcohol or caffeine because they can cause further dehydration, making conditions worse. The above info was copied from Texas A & M OEM.
